August 19, 2020
5:30 p.m.

The Atlantic City Council met in regular session in the Council Chambers at City Hall with Mayor Jones presiding. Council members present were: Behrens, McCurdy, and Brink. Present via Zoom: Hartkopf and Garrett. Absent: Somers.

Motion by McCurdy; second by Brink to approve the agenda as posted. All ayes. Motion carried.

Council recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Casady; second by Garrett to approve the consent agenda which included the following: Minutes of the August 5, 2020 City Council meeting; minutes of the August 12, 2020 City Council meeting; Tree Trimmer Permits for Dimig Handyman Service and Aaron Sindt Tree Service; Class C Liquor License with Outdoor Service for The Elbow Room; Class C Liquor License with Sunday Sales and Outdoor Service for Fireside Lounge; July 2020 Clerk's Report; July 2020 Budget & Revenue reports; and bills totaling \$84,762.88. All ayes. Motion carried.

Council reviewed the Planning & Zoning Commission's report on the partial vacating of right-of-way between Hemlock & Sycamore Streets, south of East 18th Street. Motion by Brink, second by Behrens to proceed with vacating of right-of-way. All ayes. Motion carried.

City Administrator Lund reported that he was wrapping up committee recommendations, would be presenting a resolution to apply for CARES Act money – city could see a substantial amount; reviewed wastewater ordinances with Personnel & Finance- will bring rebate information and ordinance changes to next council meeting.

Mayor Jones reminded everyone to keep their lawns mowed and commented on the recent vandalism to the park restrooms.

Council Reports: McCurdy – Personnel & Finance; Hartkopf – Airport; Casady- CPC, Library Board, AMU; Garrett- Chamber, Safety, Planning & Zoning; Brink- CADCO, Park & Rec.

Student Representative Report: School starts 8/24; teachers went back on 8/19; fall activities beginning; update on Trojan Bowl.

Council Member Casady wanted clarification on permission given to Code Enforcement Officer Kris Erickson to determine nuisance properties other than those that are complained about. The Mayor affirmed that she does have permission to do so.

Council Member McCurdy commented on the downtown renovation.

Council Member Behrens asked about the status of Clark Street now that the bike path is there. He was told that the street is now a bike path.

Council Member Garrett commented on a grant for commercial second story renovation.

Council Member Casady advised that the no parking signs have not been placed on 12th Street.

Motion by Behrens; second by McCurdy to adjourn at 5:54 p.m. All ayes. Motion carried.
