

The Atlantic City Council met in regular session in the Council Chambers at City Hall with Mayor Garrett presiding. Council members present were: Otte, Behrens, Sisco, McCurdy, Hartkopf (via phone), Halder and Brink. Absent: None.

Motion by McCurdy; second by Sisco to approve agenda as posted. All ayes. Motion carried.

Council recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Brink; second by Otte to approve the consent agenda as follows: Minutes of the February 16, 2022 City Council meeting; Minutes of the February 23, 2022 City Council meeting; 5- day Class C Liquor License with Sunday Sales for Iowa Western Community College (March 4- march 8); Class C Beer permit with Sunday Sales for Dollar General #111; Change of Ownership for Hy Vee Wine & Spirits and Hy Vee Grocery Store; and bills totaling \$175,493.18. All ayes. Motion carried.

Mayor Garrett administered the Oath of Office to Police Officer Jimmy James.

At 5:32 p.m., Mayor Garrett opened the public hearing for the FY 2023 Maximum Property Tax Dollars for Certain Levies. There were no comments. Motion by McCurdy; second by Behrens to close the public hearing at 5:33 p.m.

Motion by McCurdy; second by Sisco to approve Resolution #09-22 "FY 2023 MAXIMUM PROPERTY TAX DOLLARS FOR CERTAIN LEVIES." Ayes: McCurdy, Hartkopf, Halder, Brink, Otte, Behrens, Sisco. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Halder; second by Hartkopf to approve Resolution #10-22 "ADOPTING THE PRELIMINARY FY 2023 BUDGET AND SETTING THE DATE FOR PUBLIC HEARING ON MARCH 16, 2022 TO ADOPT THE FY 2023 BUDGET." Ayes: Halder, Brink, Otte, Behrens, Sisco, McCurdy, Hartkopf. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Brink; second by Behrens to approve Resolution #11-22 "SETTING THE DATE FOR PUBLIC HEARING ON MARCH 16, 2022, TO ADOPT THE PROPOSED FY 2023 TEN-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN (CIP)". Ayes: Brink, Otte, Behrens, Sisco, McCurdy, Hartkopf, Halder. Nays: None. Motion carried.

City Administrator's Report: returned from vacation and catching up on emails; housing moving forward- Personnel & Finance to meet March 3rd to discuss; productive Department Head meeting on March 1 which focused on HR; next council meeting will be a longer meeting.

Mayor Garrett reminded citizens that there are several June events planned in Atlantic and now is the time to start cleaning up properties. She wants to make Atlantic shine.

City Council Reports: Halder-Landfill; Brink – Park and Rec, CPC; Otte- Chamber Ambassadors; Behrens – Cass County Public Safety, Fire Department; Sisco – AMU.

Engineer Dave Sturm gave an update on the Bull Creek Project- trees are being removed and the project is out for bid. Council Members Brink and Halder mentioned that the fence at Harl Holt park is badly in need of replacement.
