City Administrator's Report: Community Protection meeting in near future to discuss three way stop sign; Liability Insurance over \$30,000 increase; LOST payments will change the way they are distributed-expectation is that payments will be higher and will making tracking easier; Council work session scheduled for July 14<sup>th</sup>- any topics that council would like discussed see John after meeting.

Mayor Garrett: No community issues during fireworks and thanks to community as a whole for adhering to time limits; pool staff now has 6 lifeguards with 2 to attend training in July. Mayor Garrett applauded the pool staff for the work that they are doing. Atlantic is above the state average because some pools are not open every day or not opening all pools in city. There are standards set by Red Cross for safety – quota for swimmers per lifeguard- Atlantic sets that criteria a little lower so that if a family comes in, they can be accommodated. Mayor Garrett thanked the community for its support and asked pool patrons to please respect safety parameters set by Red Cross and City. She added that the pool staff was doing a great job and deserved kudos.
