

**RESOLUTION NO. 2017-017**  
**ESTABLISH SPEED LIMIT ON PORTION OF ROAD #6 of 1880**

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors is empowered under authority of Sections 321.255 and 321.285 to determine upon the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation that the speed limit on any secondary road is greater than is reasonable and proper under the conditions found to exist, and may determine and declare a reasonable and proper speed limit; and

**WHEREAS**, the county engineer concluded that no new engineering and traffic investigation was warranted on this approximate 1/4 mile long roadway with a stop sign on the east and a 10 mph curve to the west where the road turns north; and

**WHEREAS**, the board of supervisors believe the existing conditions warrant the setting of a speed limit less than the maximum allowed on roadway without a restricted speed limit; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Griswold has determined that the speed permitted by State law upon its portion of Troy Road is greater than is necessary for the safe operation of vehicles thereon, and has declared that the maximum speed limit upon its portion of Troy Road shall be 25 miles per hour; and

**WHEREAS**, the board of supervisors concurs with the conclusions of the Griswold city council; and

**WHEREAS**, the speed limits as determined by the board of supervisors shall be effective when appropriate signs giving notice of the speed limits are erected at the portion of secondary roadway;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Cass County Board of Supervisors that speed limits be established and signs erected at the locations described as follows:

All of Cass County Road #6 of 1880 (now known as Troy Road and Cass Street) from Adair Street (Highway 48) to its intersection with Cass Street in the city of Griswold: 25 miles per hour speed limit.
